Team Nominations, Registration and Fee Information

Team Nominations

Team Nominations are the first step in joining our social competitions. Each team needs to appoint a 'team contact' who will be the point of contact between the Association and the team. The 'team contact' will be required to complete a Team Nomination Form, which will be sent to the 'team contact' in a separate attachment.

Teams must have a minimum of seven (7) players listed to be eligible to nominate, and a maximum of ten (10). Once teams have nominated, the 'team contact' will be emailed a link for all individual players to register themselves.

Registration and Fee Information

Each player is required to pay their individual registration via Netball Connect before they are eligible to take the court. Netball Connect will allow a choice of whether all fees are paid upfront, or via an instalment process.

Player Registration:

- \$67 upon initial registration
 \$37 covers the 2024 Netball Queensland registration/insurance fee and \$30 covers the Caboolture Netball competition fee.
- Once a player has paid the Netball Queensland player/social player fee during the calendar year, they will only be charged the Caboolture Netball competition fee upon further competition registrations, e.g. players who register for subsequent CNA competitions within a calendar year will only pay the applicable competition fee per competition joined.

Individual Court Fees:

- \$85 per season
- If using the instalment function during the registration process, fees are due in 3 payments, one upfront, and the second two by Round 4 as per the instalment date in the Netball Connect registration process.



Venue Location and Fixture Format

Shirley Tinney Netball Complex, Caboolture Netball Association 15 Riverview Street, Caboolture QLD 4510

Fixtures are run at the Caboolture Netball Association outdoor courts. Games are generally played at 6:30pm, 7:20pm, or 8:10pm (depending on the competition format) with fixtures released through the NetballConnect app, available for download via Apple Store and Google Play

Rules

To be eligible to nominate a team, the team must list a minimum of seven (7) and maximum of ten (10) players and provide a contact person (mobile and email required). All players are required to be registered with Netball Queensland and Caboolture Netball Association before being allowed to take the court. Players need to register for each competition that they participate in (e.g. Monday Night Ladies, Tuesday Night, Saturday Club Competition).

Players Filling in for Teams

Players can fill in across competitions. Players cannot fill in for a team that is in a lower or equal division to the team they are registered with. Any players substituting for another must adhere to the following rules:

- A fill in player must have a current Netball Queensland registration.
- Original team players must be on the court before a fill in player can join the game. Exceptions only where an original player is sick or injured and cannot take the court.
- Where a player is filling in within the same competition they are registered in, they cannot play in a lower or equal division.
- No player can fill in across competitions for more than three (3) games for any team. For clarification, a fill in player cannot exceed twelve (12) quarters with one team. Should they exceed the twelve (12) quarters they will be required to register as a member of that team.
- Any fill in players must be written on the scoresheet with their current registration/division listed.
- Teams need to ensure that fill in players adhere to the age restriction rules. For clarification, please see below ruling regarding 15-year-olds.



Age Restrictions

The Tuesday Night Competition is for female and male players 15 years and older. The following age restrictions apply:

- Players must be fifteen (15) years old as of Round 1 to be eligible to participate.
- Any fifteen (15) year old female player must also be actively playing in our Winter Saturday competition to be eligible to participate in the Weeknight competitions.
- Teams may only register four (4) players that are fifteen (15) years old per team, with a maximum of ten (10) players per team.
- Players under fifteen (15) years old are not permitted to play in the Tuesday Competition

Finals Eligibility and Forfeits

To be eligible to play in a finals game, a player must have played at least twelve (12) full competitive quarters within that team in that season.

Teams cannot take the court with less than 5 of their original players. A forfeit is called if the team does not have five (5) original players after five (5) minutes past the original game time. For example, if a team has only four (4) players at the start of their 6:30pm game, the umpires will hold the game. If by 6:35pm the team still only has four (4) players present, then the team automatically forfeits.

Uniforms

The uniform acceptable for this competition is:

Suitable sports shirt, singlet, skirts, shorts – no pockets, or, if not possible, pockets to be taped for safety reasons, full length or ¾ length leggings, dress of length that does not reveal underwear before movement.

Players must always wear their team approved uniform. Players playing out of uniform may be granted a three (3) week exemption upon request to the Night Coordinator. Extensions can be granted upon request if required.

New teams or any changes to existing team uniforms need to be submitted for approval to the Night Coordinator (nightcomp@cabnetball.org.au) prior to purchasing.



Jewellery and Gloves

In line with the Rules of Netball I draw your attention to the following.

Section 5.1.1 (iv) Players (page 22-23)

Players may not wear anything that could endanger themselves or other players, specifically;

- (a) No adornment or jewellery may be worn other than a wedding ring which must be covered with tape
- (b) A medical alert bracelet may be worn provided it is covered with tape
- (c) Fingernails must be short and smooth
- (d) Hair must be suitably tied back

In light of this rule CNA will be implementing the same policy regarding the abovementioned matters regarding jewellery; therefore, no more exemptions or waiver forms will be accepted or taping of jewellery (other than the items listed above). Therefore, no jewellery is permitted to be worn. The only exemptions are taped wedding bands and/or alert bracelets.

Netball approved gloves may be worn. These gloves need to be approved by the umpire of the game prior to taking the court each time they are worn. Nails should not be able to be seen or felt through the fingertips.



Umpires

Caboolture Netball Association is responsible for supplying umpires for this competition. Umpires must be suitably attired in a white shirt and black skirt/shorts/skorts. Exemption for those umpires that play prior to or after umpiring, they may wear a white shirt over their playing uniform.

There is <u>zero tolerance</u> for abuse against umpires and games will be monitored closely. Poor behaviour demonstrated by players, scorers, and spectators may include eye-rolling, arguing, speaking rudely under your breath, slamming the ball down, or refusing to adjust where advised, are examples. Should a team wish to ask for clarification around a call, during an end of quarter break, the team captain may approach the umpire and ask them a direct question only.

Insurance

All players are insured through their Netball Queensland registrations (the \$37 payment made upon registration). The Netball Queensland Personal Injury claim form can be accessed via the following link: click here to make a claim.

Points System

Win = 2 points; Draw = 1 point; Loss = 0 points. Teams will be awarded 2 points for a Bye.

Finals will be played between the top four (4) teams based on points as per the competition ladder. In the event of qual points, the team(s) with the highest goal ratio will be awarded the higher position.

Semi Finals will be 1^{st} v 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} v 4^{th} games as per the ladder. Winner of the 3^{rd} v 4^{th} game will play the loser of the 1^{st} v 2^{nd} game. The Grand final is played between the winner of the 1^{st} v 2^{nd} game and the winner of the preliminary final.

In the event of drawn games for all finals there will be a two (2) minute break during which there may be substitutions and/or team changes. At the end of those two (2) minutes, there are a further two (2) five (5) minute halves played. At the end of the first half, teams will change ends with no substitutions or team changes allowed. If at the end of the second half the scores are still level, then play continues until one (1) team has a two (2) goal lead.
